The Salvation Army, an international movement, is an evangelical part of the universal Christian church. Its message is based on the Bible. Its ministry is motivated by the love of God. Its mission is to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ and to meet human needs in His name without discrimination.

What We Do

The Salvation Army has been supporting those in need in His name without discrimination since 1865. Nearly 33 million Americans receive assistance from The Salvation Army each year through the broadest array of social services that range from providing food for the hungry, relief for disaster victims, assistance for the disabled, outreach to the elderly and ill, clothing and shelter to the homeless and opportunities for underprivileged children.

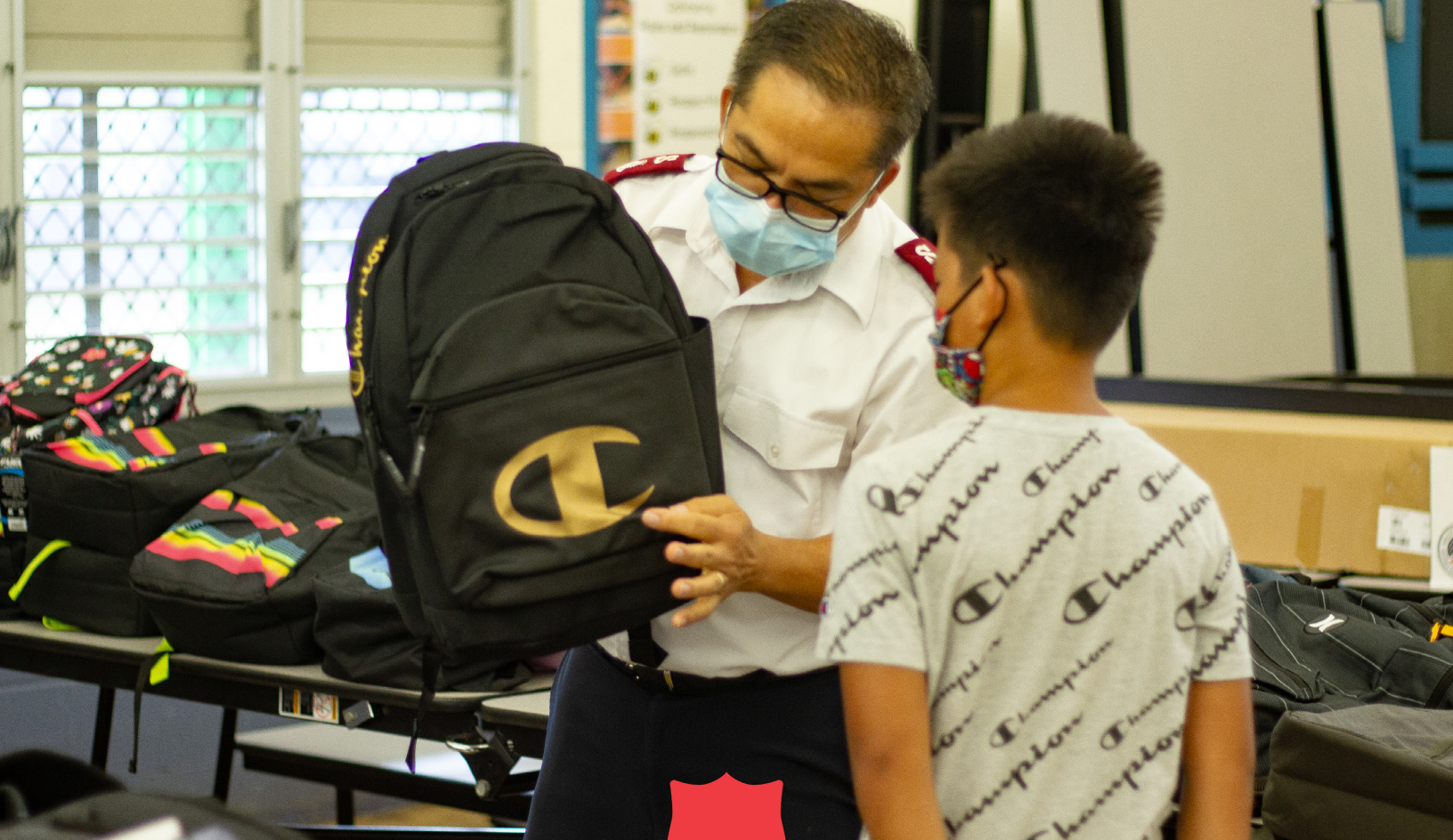
About 83 cents of every dollar raised is used to support those services in nearly 9,000 communities nationwide.

Our History in Hawaii

The first Salvation Army hall was located in Downtown Honolulu at 1680 South King Street. In the late 1890s, Dr. Theodore Richards gave the Army a building in the Vineyard and River Street section of Honolulu to center its activities. Today, that same location is used as part of the Kauluwela Mission Corps at 296 North Vineyard Boulevard.

By November 1894, The Salvation Army had established its work in Hilo on the Island of Hawaii. Within the next three years, the Army was established on Maui and Kauai as well. Today, The Salvation Army has grown into a well-established and comprehensive network of social services and religious programs in Hawaii serving thousands of men, women and children each year.

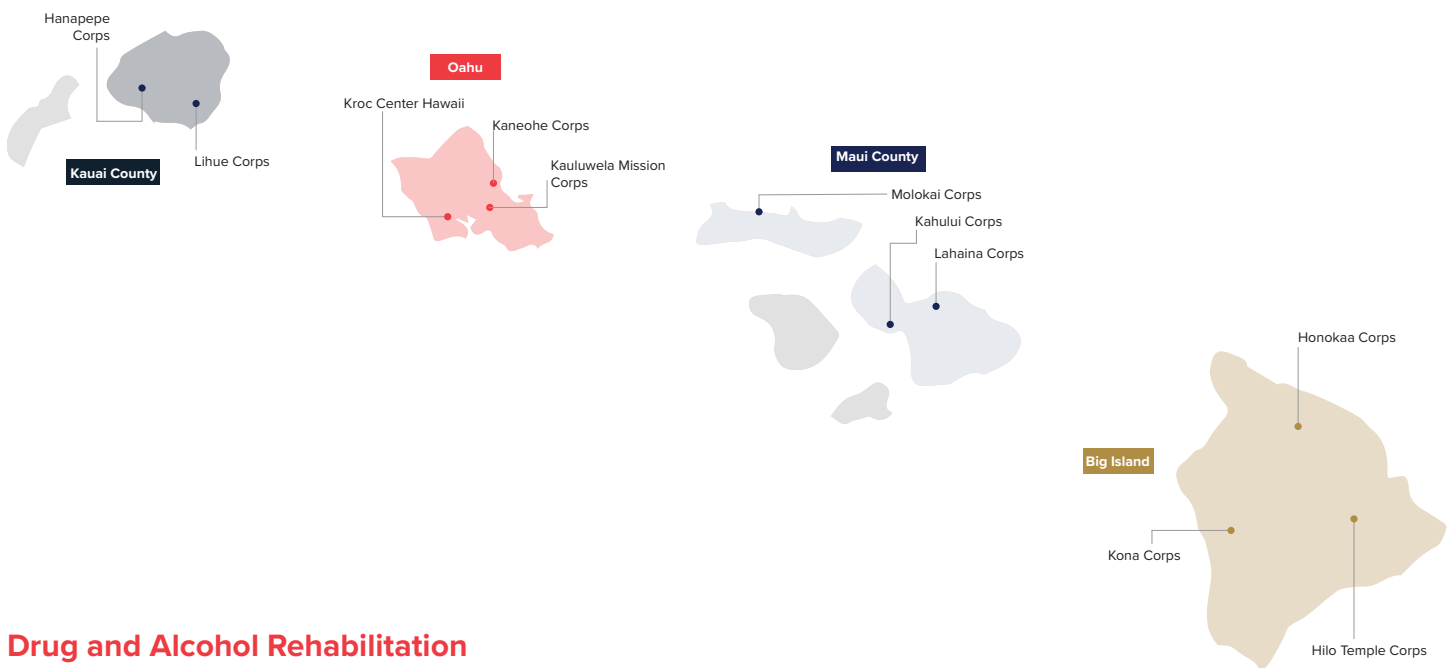

Corps Community Centers

We operate corps community centers that offer a full range of programs for all ages, including worship, spiritual support, preschools, supplemental meals for keiki in need, youth services, and music and dance programs for all ages. The Kroc Center in Kapolei is the largest community center of its kind in Hawaii. Facility highlights include competition/lap pool, group fitness classes, health & wellness center, worship & performing arts center, multi-use gymnasium, child watch center, family pool with water slides, outdoor activity fields, state-of-the-art fitness equipment, banquet/conference center, game room, art studio, and dormitories.

We have 12 corps community centers located on five islands:



Drug and Alcohol Rehabilitation

Addiction Treatment Services (ATS)

Provides a comprehensive continuum of substance abuse treatment services for adult men and women with alcohol and/or drug problems. Accredited levels of care include detoxification, residential treatment, day treatment, and outpatient treatment.

Family Treatment Services (FTS)

Through a network of interrelated programs, Family Treatment Services provides substance abuse treatment specifically designed for women with children. FTS provides specialized mental health services for young children and their parents and is the only licensed residential treatment facility in Hawaii that allows women to have their children with them during treatment for substance abuse disorders.



Adult Rehabilitation Center (ARC)

A 75-bed residential drug and alcohol rehabilitation center for adult males that offers work therapy programs. All proceeds from our thrift stores on Oahu fund the ARC program in Iwilei, where those in the grip of addiction can regain their self-respect and acquire the life skills needed to take their rightful place in life.

Youth Services

Camp Homelani

Offers children, seniors, and families a fun-filled outing and week-long residential camping experience on Oahu's North Shore. Community service summer camps for children in need enrich lives and increase creativity and independence.

Family Intervention Services (FIS)

Provides a full range of outreach, prevention, and residential services to youth. Services focus on runaways, minor law violators, victims of child abuse and/or neglect, and other at-risk youth.

Revolution Hawaii (RevHI)

RevHI is a three-month to one-year urban mission and discipleship program based at Camp Homelani with outreach to those in need in Hawaii and Micronesia.

Basic Needs

Family Services Office (FSO)

Provides basic needs and financial assistance to individuals and families including clothing, and food assistance, short-term emergency utility and rental

assistance, referral services, and budgeting/nutrition workshops.

Hale Palekana Drop

In Center Provides basic services to many of Lahaina's displaced and homeless individuals and families, including meals, showers, laundry facilities, counseling, and telephone facilities to help the unemployed in their job search.

CAC/Pathway of Hope

Helps individuals and families in transition to break the cycle of poverty and drug addiction. Pathway of Hope case managers assist motivated clients in securing employment, finding permanent housing, and being a part of a supportive community. The program guides clients to self-sufficiency, to become contributing members of society.

Emergency Disaster Services

We stand ready to serve the community in the event of a disaster. While every disaster is unique and creates its own special response, the core of The Salvation Army's disaster response program includes mass feeding, mobile feeding, volunteer services, reconstruction, pastoral care/counseling, financial assistance, and donations management.

Holiday Support

Through our Red Kettle and Angel Tree programs, we provide holiday support and gifts so families won't have to choose between paying the bills or buying presents for their keiki.
